### **Reddish Hall School Remote Learning Policy Update - Summer 2021**

#### **Introduction**

This policy statement has been produced to provide a coherent framework from which all staff, pupils and parents/carers can develop a consistent and effective approach to remote learning. As restrictions nationwide are easing and all schools have returned to school full time, this policy has been updated to reflect this.

#### **Aims of this policy**

To ensure that the school communicates the expectations in relation to remote learning effectively to the school community as well as it can.

To ensure mental well-being is at the core and is embedded in the remote learning and outreach we provide as a school.

To ensure home learning activities are stimulating, engaging and relevant to the needs of the pupil.

To provide expectations for home learning for all year groups and support proportionate and purposeful home learning activities.

#### **Expectations and Responsibilities of our Learners**

Pupils should practise and build on what they have learned in school to support their remote learning.

Pupils should attempt and engage with remote learning to the best of their ability.

Teaching or support staff should communicate tasks and deadlines clearly to both pupils and parents.

#### **Expectations and Responsibilities of Parents and Carers**

To aim where possible, to create an environment which supports time management and a quiet space.

Contact the school to seek further support or advice if needed.

#### **Expectations of the School and Staff**

For those children needing to self-isolate, staff should provide home learning activities which link to and support classroom learning.

These activities should be matched to pupils' ability and should be a combination of paper based, online, interactive and independent work where appropriate.

Staff should take extra care not to overburden pupils with excessive home learning tasks.

All teaching staff should communicate tasks and deadlines clearly to both pupils and parents.

Staff will provide appropriate materials and online resources to complete home learning.

Staff will ensure support is available for pupils who need space, time or further advice to complete home learning tasks.

Any concerns raised through home learning should be discussed with the child's class/form tutor in the first instance.
