



Achievement with ambition

Our 2025-26 outcomes show the strength of an ambitious, personalised curriculum. Pupils achieved across academic and vocational pathways, with growing success at Level 2 and access to the very highest GCSE grades.

48% GRADES
AT GRADE 4+

Nearly half of all grades met the standard pass benchmark, up from 14% two years ago.

8 GRADES AT 7-9

Top grades included a grade 9 in English, grade 8 in maths and grade 7s across science, humanities and computing.

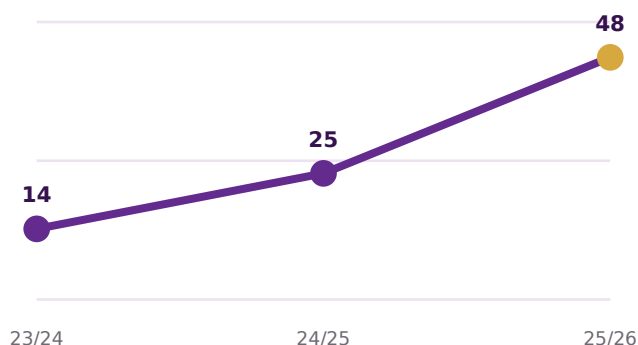
300+ QUALIFICATIONS ACHIEVED

from Year 7 upwards within one year

This reflects accreditation across GCSEs, Functional Skills, vocational and personal development pathways. Year 11 pupils achieved 7.6 qualifications each on average.

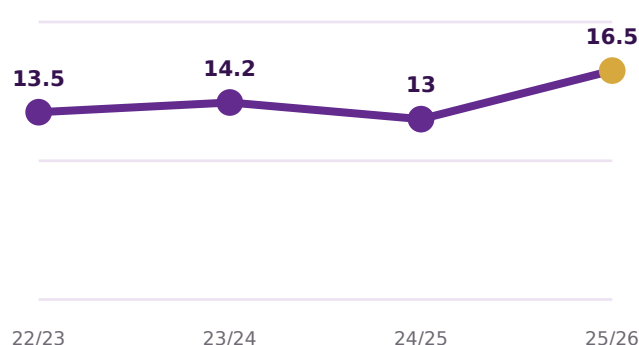
IMPROVEMENT OVER TIME

AVERAGE POINTS SCORE



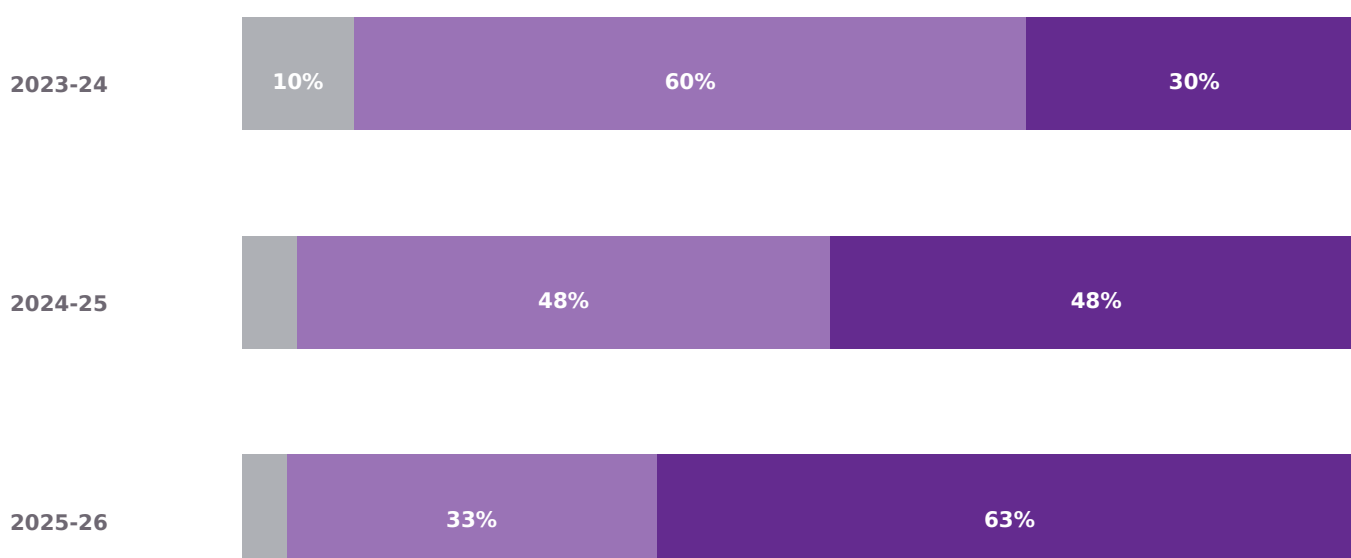
Average qualification points per pupil increased strongly and reached a four-year high.



More pupils reaching Level 2

The strongest year-on-year shift is towards Level 2 qualifications, including GCSE grades 4-9 and equivalent awards. This gives more pupils recognised outcomes that support progression into further study, training and employment.

This is the highest proportion across the three-year trend and represents a clear improvement from 30% in 2023-24.

A BROAD, RECOGNISED PORTFOLIO

Achievement spans GCSEs, Functional Skills, vocational qualifications and personal development awards. Pupils leave with a portfolio matched to their strengths and next steps, while access to the highest GCSE grades remains firmly part of our offer.

Year 11 cohorts are small and vary in starting points and need. Percentages are therefore read alongside wider evidence: rising Level 2 outcomes, stronger GCSE passes and substantial whole-school accreditation.
